


"II.D.6. A council may establish local dues or membership fees as it may deem to be appropriate but such dues or fees must be in addition to, not in lieu of, the national dues."

MARILYN JOHANSEN ARTIST AND AUTHOR

There were several exhibitions locally, the Galleria Mall, The L.A Lee/ Mizel YMCA and the Fort Lauderdale/Hollywood International Airport. Currently the paintings are up again at the Fort Lauderdale/Hollywood International Airport to educate everyone about a Navy ship named for our city.

My Memoir, My Father's Secrets, was just released. Would you be interested in book signings and reading events? Below is a description of the book. Many people think that the military family experience is the surprise reunion when in fact it is so much more. This is why I wrote this memoir.

I grew up the daughter of an Air Force fighter pilot. My family moved around the world with my father's assignments! I lived in many places in the U.S. along with assignments in

Europe and Asia. My book is about my family and the history and times we lived and the wars my father fought. Most Military kids live on the front row of history not able to let anyone know where and when or why they move. All this is to protect our country! My book is now available on Amazon and Barnes and Noble website.



Overview

My Father's Secrets is a compelling memoir of a child raised in an Air Force military family living through the Korean War, the Cold War, and into the Vietnam Era. Her father had been in WWII as a P-38 pilot and then a POW; his career would span three wars as a fighter pilot.

As the daughter of a career Air Force pilot, world events would come to dictate her life. She never knew where she would live next. She was the "kid from nowhere and everywhere."

Marilyn Johansen grew up in the front row of history. In My Father's Secrets, she tells the fascinating story of her family's struggles and joys, as well as her father's hidden intelligence gathering activities during reconnaissance flights and secret missions. Theirs was an "invisible" military family, living in far-flung locales across the world, always aware that the quality of their lives came second to the importance of protecting the United States — whether during wartime or peacetime.

GUEST SPEAKER AT OUR FEBRUARY 12TH DINNER MEETING LIEUTENANT JUSTIN B. DADLANI, UNITED STATES COAST GUARD COMMANDING OFFICER, STATION FORT LAUDERDALE

Lieutenant Justin Dadlani is the Commanding Officer of USCG Station Fort Lauderdale, FL. As one of the largest boat stations in the USCG, it is one of the largest boat stations in the service and boasts nearly 100 members, both Active Duty and Reserve.

Lieutenant Dadlani was previously assigned to the USCG's Office of Boat Forces where he served as the Platform Manager for the Response Boat – Small fleet, as well as the entire aids to navigation boat fleet. Lieutenant Dadlani laid the groundwork for the next generation fleet to include the Response Boat – Small, 3rd Generation, Trailerable Aids to Navigation Boat, 2nd Generation, and Aids to Navigation Boat – Large.

From 2017 to 2020, Lieutenant Dadlani was assigned as a permanent Command Duty Officer in the Joint Harbor Operations Center at USCG Sector San Diego, CA.

Lieutenant Dadlani's primary duty was to act as the Sector Commander's direct representative by ensuring proper planning, execution, and notification regarding all mission response in the San Diego area of responsibility.



Lieutenant Dadlani enlisted in the Coast Guard in November of 2011, and after completing Recruit Training, was assigned to USCG Station Port Canaveral, FL from 2012 to 2017 as a Boat Crewman and Boarding Team Member. Before leaving his first unit, Lieutenant Dadlani was advanced to Boatswain's Mate Second Class and held certifications as Tactical Coxswain, Boarding Officer, and Station Officer of the Day.

Lieutenant Dadlani is a proud graduate of Officer Candidate School class 2-17, receiving his Commission on 09 May 2017. He holds a Master of Business Administration specializing in Project Management from Florida Institute of Technology. His awards include three Coast Guard Commendation Medals, two Coast Guard Achievement Medals, and other personal and unit awards. He has also earned the Advanced Boat Forces Insignia and the Response Operations Ashore Insignia.

Lieutenant Dadlani and his wife, Jessica, are natives of Coral Springs, FL. They have two sons, Nicholas and Daniel.


