

Upon completion of Basic Training in Cape May, New Jersey she received orders to her first assignment at Station Port O'Connor, Texas. A critical fill opportunity became available on CGC BRANT (WPB-87348) in Corpus Christi, Texas where she transferred and struck Boatswain Mate and advanced to Third Class Petty Officer. Other assignments include CGC KATHERINE WALKER (WLM-552), CG Station Jones Beach, and CGC HARRY CLAIBORNE (WLM-561). Currently, Chief McGuigan is the Officer in Charge of Aids to Navigation Team Fort Lauderdale located in Dania Beach, FL.

Chief Boatswain's Mate McGuigan's personal awards include two Coast Guard Commendation Medals, Coast Guard Achievement Medal, and three Letter of Commendations, all accompanied with the Operational Distinguishing device. Other awards include various team, unit, and service awards and four Good Conduct medals. Chief McGuigan also earned the Permanent Cutterman Insignia and Advanced Boat Forces Operations Insignia.

Chief Boatswain's Mate McGuigan is married to her husband Chief Machinery Technician Thomas McGuigan and have two beautiful daughters, Carsen (8) and Teagen (2).





**GUEST SPEAKER AT OUR NOVEMBER 19TH DINNER MEETING**  
**CAPTAIN WILLIE L. CARMICHAEL**  
**CHIEF OF STAFF, U.S. COAST GUARD DISTRICT SOUTHEAST**

Captain Carmichael reported as the Chief of Staff of the Coast Guard District Southeast on June 2024, headquartered in Miami, Florida. As Chief of Staff, he is responsible for the oversight of Coast Guard operations in the Southeast United States and the Caribbean basin and the leadership of a combined active duty, reserve, civilian and volunteer workforce of over 9,000 members. The Seventh District encompasses an area of 1.8 million square miles and shares operational borders with 34 Foreign Nations and Territories.

Prior to being selected as the D7 Chief of Staff, Captain Carmichael served as the D7 Chief of Response, where he directed the execution of Search and Rescue, Law Enforcement, Ports, Waterways and Coastal Security, Incident Management and Contingency Preparedness for Coast Guard assets operating in South Carolina, Georgia, the Florida Peninsula, Puerto Rico and the entire Caribbean Basin covering 1.8M miles.



Throughout his distinguished career, Captain Carmichael has held numerous high-profile command positions, exemplifying his leadership and expertise in maritime operations. His roles have included serving as the Commanding Officer of the USCGC MIDGETT (WMSL 757), CGC TAHOMA (WMEC 908), CGC JEFFERSON ISLAND (WPB-1340), CGC WRANGELL (WPB-1332), as well as the Commodore of the Patrol Forces Southwest Asia, where he played a pivotal role in operations throughout the Middle East.

With a career that spans over two decades, Captain Carmichael has amassed more than 14 years of sea duty, marking his tenure on nine different cutters and underscoring his profound commitment to maritime service. His extensive experience at sea is complemented by his significant contributions in various staff assignments, which include serving as the Coast Guard's Liaison Officer to the U.S. Southern Command and as the Program Manager for the Coast Guard's innovative High Tempo High Maintenance dual crewing initiative for eight patrol boats from 2008 to 2012.

Captain Carmichael's exceptional service has been recognized with several prestigious military awards, including Meritorious Service Medals, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Coast Guard Commendation Medals, Coast Guard Achievement Medals, and Commandant's Letters of Commendation, in addition to various team and unit accolades.

A proud native of Chesapeake, Virginia, Captain Carmichael's academic background is as impressive as his military career. He is an alumnus of the U.S. Coast Guard Academy, graduating in 1996 with a Bachelor of Science in Math-Computer Science. He furthered his education by earning a Master's in Business Administration from American Military University, preparing him for the complex challenges of modern military leadership.

The Truman's strike group spent more than five months defending merchant mariners and military vessels from Houthi drones and missiles in the Red Sea and the Gulf of Aden.

The strike group also carried out strikes against the Iran-backed militants in Yemen, which was part of President Donald Trump's order to conduct daily strikes on the militants until they stopped targeting merchant ships.

Captain John-David “JD” Lentine assumed the duties of Chief of Resource Management for the Coast Guard (CG) Southeast District (CGD-SE) in July of 2024. As the CGD-SE Chief of Resource Management (dm), he is responsible for managing the financial, administrative, C5I, security & shore infrastructure planning support for CG Operations in the Southeast United States and Caribbean Basin, including Florida, Georgia, South Carolina, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

Captain Lentine reported to the CG Academy in 1996 from his hometown of Fairbanks, Alaska, and graduated in 2000 with a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering. His subsequent assignments included Deck Watch Officer – Coast Guard Cutter (CGC) Cowslip (WLB-277), Executive Officer – CGC Sturgeon Bay (WTGB-109), CG Ocean Engineering Advanced Education Program – Oregon State University, Ocean Engineer – CG Civil Engineering Unit (CEU) Miami, Design Team Chief – CG CEU Miami, Program Manager – CG Facilities Design and Construction Center (FDCC), Facility Engineer – CG Air Station Clearwater, Executive Officer – CG CEU Miami, Commanding Officer – CG CEU Miami and Executive Assistant to the CG Assistant Commandant for Engineering and Logistics (CG-4) – CG Headquarters.

Captain Lentine earned a Master of Science in Civil Engineering from Oregon State University in 2006 and a Master of Business Administration from Tulane University in 2012.




